### **Service Provider Information**

Tyler Restmore Home #2 is located in Orangeburg County at 195 Sellars Avenue, Orangeburg, SC 29115-6724. Team arrived at the facility at 10:00 AM and exited the facility at 12:30 PM. The administrator, Michelle Antley, was present during the inspection. The facility is licensed for 9 beds. The census was 8 with 8 residents present on the day of Team's inspection. The DHEC license had an expiration date of 7-31-18. The administrator's license had an expiration date of 6-30-18.

### **Overview of Visit**

During Team's visit we interviewed three residents; talked to residents and staff; reviewed staff records, reviewed three residents' records, medication, and medication administration records, and toured the facility. Team conducted an exit interview with the administrator. The facility had a written emergency shelter plan to evacuate to Impact Church located at 593 Neeses Highway, Orangeburg, South Carolina 29115.

### **Report Summary**

During Team's inspection, the hot water temperature in the kitchen tested high at 140° Fahrenheit. In the females' bathroom, there was chipped paint on the ceiling, around

the window trim, and the wall near the commode needed to be repaired. Also, the shower head was not secured. In the males' bathroom, there was chipped paint on the ceiling and walls, the grab-bar was loose, and the tub's knobs were not secured. At the sink the water drained slowly. Two residents wanted in-season clothes, another resident wanted deodorant, and one resident wanted shoes.

One resident's prescription medication for DOK 100 mg was not on hand. (The administrator confirmed the medication was scheduled to be delivered after 2 PM that day.)

One resident's prescription medication for Dival Proex 250 mg was not on hand. (The administrator confirmed the medication was scheduled to be delivered after 2 PM that day.)

One resident's prescription medication for Fluoxetine HCL 40 mg was not on hand. (The administrator confirmed the medication was scheduled to be delivered after 2 PM that day.)

One resident's prescription medication for Quetiapine 400 mg was not on hand. (The administrator confirmed the medication was scheduled to be delivered after 2 PM that day.)

In the entertainment room, the ceiling fan blades needed to be dusted and a new light bulb was needed. In the males' bathroom, the blinds had rust stains and around the tub were noticeable areas of heavy soap scum and mildew. In the females' bathroom, the floor vent needed to be dusted.

### **Areas of Commendation**

- The administrator and staff were polite and professional.
- The staff responded promptly to inspection requests.
- The facility was adequately furnished.
- The residents' entertainment room was cozy and home like.
- The facility's fire extinguishers were inspected and the extinguisher's card tag was initialed by staff.
- The monthly menu for February was posted.
- The outdoor screened-in sitting area was inviting.
- Three residents stated the food is appetizing.
- Three residents felt safe in the facility.
- Two residents love the administrator and like living in the facility.
- The residents were able to access all living areas of the facility.
- The facility's room temperatures were comfortable.

## **Areas Needing Improvement**

### **Health/Safety**

- The hot water temperature in the kitchen tested high at 140° Fahrenheit.
- In the females' bathroom, there was chipped paint on the ceiling, around the window trim, and the wall near the commode needed to be repaired.
- In the females' bathroom, the shower head was not secured.
- In the males' bathroom, there was chipped paint on the ceiling and the walls.
- In the males' bathroom, the grab-bar and the tub's knobs were not secured.
- The sink in the males' bathroom also drained slowly.

### **Supervision & Administrator**

- No concerns were noted.

- Two residents wanted in-season clothes.
- One resident wanted deodorant.
- One resident wanted shoes.

### **Recreation**

- One resident's prescription medication for Fluoxetine HCL 40 mg was not on hand. (The administrator confirmed the medication was scheduled to be delivered after 2 PM that day.)

- One resident's prescription medication for Quetiapine 400 mg was not on hand. (The administrator confirmed the medication was scheduled to be delivered after 2 PM that day.)

- In the females' bathroom the floor vent needed to be dusted.
